

During America's early years, domestic textile production was limited. The small amount of fabric that was produced in the states was locally woven and the dyes that were used were naturally produced.

Indigo blues were one of the first fabrics produced in America due to the availability of indigo from farms that developed in the south. Because it was a stable dye color, indigo was often a choice of quiltmakers in the 1800's. Today, blues, combined with infinite shades of complimentary colors, are still a favorite quilt color.



**Gnocchi Soup** (Olive Garden Copycat Recipe)

3-4 skinless chicken breast fillets, cooked and diced 1 stalk celery, chopped

1 Stark celery, chopped

1/2 white onion, diced 2 teaspoons minced garlic 1/2 cup shredded carrots

- 1 tablespoon olive oil 4 cups chicken broth
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 teaspoon thyme



16 ounces potato gnocchi (found in pasta section) 2 cups half and half

1 cup fresh spinach, roughly chopped

*First,* heat olive oil and saute celery, onions, garlic, and carrots for 2-3 minutes until onions are translucent.

**Second,** add chicken, chicken broth, salt, pepper, and thyme, bring to boil then gently stir in gnocchi *(I cut gnocchi in half and use 3/4 bag).* Boil 3-4 minutes longer and then reduce heat to a simmer for 10 minutes.

*Third,* stir in half and half and spinach and cook another 1-2 minutes until spinach is tender. Add additional broth and salt and pepper if necessary and serve.
