Quilling and Wool

The earliest quilts of America were made of wool, linen, or a mixture of the two. Although quiltmakers embraced the arrival of cotton as a finer, more easily manipulated cloth, wool remains popular as a medium to colorfully embellish quilts through the use of hand and machine applique.

Several members of MVQ are very accomplished in wool applique and have shared their work and favorite links for this newsletter issue.



Sue Spargo is an international teacher whose work features dimensional layering and embroidery using wools saturated in bright colors.

Missouri Valley Quilt Guild Board Meeting Held on Teams March 3, 2021

Treasurer's Report: \$5,664.30, of which \$209.49 belongs to Warm Start

Discussion:

Barb Headrick attended the meeting to give us a wrap up of the recent FFF retreat. It was a very successful, well-received retreat with 47 registrants. Those registered came from 9 states and encompassed 4 time zones. The majority of people worked on the mystery quilt. Barb will compile a slide show once she receives quilt pictures from most who took part. The money generated by the registrations was used to purchase door prizes. We are booked to hold the next FFF retreat on February 18-20, 2022 at Camp of the Cross.

The church council at House of Prayer has approved our Covid-19 meeting guidelines.

The Board made the decision that no meeting will be held in March. We are hoping to hold a meeting in April at House of Prayer. The meeting will be held indoors, with social distancing and mask wearing. No food or drinks will be served.

Laurie Sheldon will include the Covid-19 meeting guidelines in the March Newsletter and will survey whether members are willing to attend an in-person meeting in April.

The April meeting will be a large show and tell.

Sandi Washek will get the second key card for the church from Louise Selkowe.

We have an opportunity for a fund raiser through a Millie P's Quilt Shop in Anoka, MN. It would be an event for our guild held on Facebook Marketplace Live. Millie offers quilt guild members a 10% discount on purchases during the event. She then gives the guild 10% of the total sales from the event. We will ask at the April meeting if members are interested in doing this.

National Quilt Day will be held at the Capital March 13-14.

Bills paid this month were for the nonprofit status with the Secretary of State and our membership in DWAC.
