### Almond Raspberry Cookies



1 cup butter (softened)1 1/2 teaspoon almond extract2/3 cup sugar2 cups flour1/2 cup seedless raspberry jam

Beat together butter, sugar and almond until creamy. Mix in flour until combined. Refrigerate for about 1 hour. Shape into 1 inch balls and place on ungreased cookie sheet. Make indentation in center of each ball with thumb and fill with 1/4 teaspoon jam.

Bake 12-14 minutes at 325 degrees. Let stand 1 minute before removing from sheet. Cool completely.

Options: Refrain from refrigerating dough and **pipe into** wreaths with cookie press. Additionally, consider drizzling with almond flavored powder sugar glaze. Yum!
