- Write your name and the number of 1/2 squares triangles enchanted on your container or envelope
- You get back the same number of triangle squares you trade

Boomerang

Boomerang — another great pattern from Julie Herman of Jaybird Designs. Like all of Julie's patterns it looks much more complicated than it actually is. It starts out with simple strip piecing and then the shapes are cut using Jaybird's Super Sidekick Ruler. The ruler isn't required but makes the process much easier. If you have

a 60 degree ruler that accommodates a 6 ½" strip that can be used as well. There is also a template shape included in the pattern so you can make your own template if you desire.

There are no Y seams in the pattern and the pattern includes 5 sizes so take your pick. Deb has also designed a table runner size if you want to start with a small project to try the technique. The pattern works with either fat quarters or regular ¼ yard cuts.

Melon Mash Quilt

The "yummy" Melon Mash Quilt consists of only three main pieces. The three pieces are sewn together and mixed and mashed with three other melon blocks to make the "big block". Can't have a failure because templates are used for cutting melon pieces and you already know how to sew a scant quarter inch seam and how to press. The curves are easy and very little pinning is required. Easy, easy recipe! I made my first melon quilt without a book.

You will receive the ingredient list after signing up for class. (If you want to do a little premixing before class (cutting your pieces) the ingredient list will have special directions). It will be important to cut three melon sets from each fat quarter. Sewing directions will be waiting for you at Retreat.

The pastel Melon Mash quilt used 36 fat quarters and measures 75" before adding borders.

The tan Melon Mash measures 90" before finishing.....

Lorrie has been quilting for a few years & has enjoyed attending the Retreat for the past several years. She lives on a ranch South of Bison, SD with her husband, dog, cows, numerous horses and more sewing machines than she can use at one time. She has great depth in knowledge in garment sewing that now extends into quilting.

\$150 Registration Fee will cover room, board and classes. (\$75 required with application.) Meals are provided. (Supper Friday evening. Brunch & Supper Saturday. Brunch Sunday)

(Cancellations before Feb. 14, 2016 will receive a refund minus a \$10 non-refundable registration fee.)

Accommodations are dormitory style cabins – (no bunk beds). Bring your own sleeping bag, pillow, towels, etc. Each cabin has its own bathrooms, but shower facilities are located in another building.

A limited number of "Private Rooms" are available for an additional \$35/person. Some of the rooms will accommodate two people, (2 single beds.) Bedding & towels are provided by the camp. These rooms will be filled on a "First comefirst served" basis. We cannot guarantee you a private room.

You will have your choice of two classes, or space will be provided to do your own projects.

(Each class will be for two days, giving time to perhaps complete a project)

Class size is limited to 16 and will be filled as registrations are received.

Applications will be accepted based on postmark, but will not be accepted early.

Open registration will begin January 1, 2017 for non-member of MVQ.
